

Eveleth Ambulance Service



The mission of the Eveleth Ambulance Service is to promptly and professionally serve the needs of the community with pride, dedication, and excellence while delivering quality emergency life safety services. Our dedicated members work to ensure the safety of the community and maintain a citywide presence to effectively respond to all emergencies and non-emergencies.

Our ambulance staff consists of 25 Emergency Medical Technicians and provides 24-hour coverage. They operate out of the Eveleth fire station at 425 Jackson Street. EMS staff responds to nearly 900 calls a year. Our team is highly trained, equipped, supported and focused on safe, immediate response and services. We are a Basic Life Support (BLS) ambulance service.

We're an organization of honorable people in an honorable profession. Our community can be assured that the Eveleth Ambulance is a trusted and reliable team dedicated to serving our communities.

We provide our members with the means, skills, and education to provide outstanding professional services. Our leaders and professional staff will do whatever is necessary to attain and provide exemplary services for the citizens and visitors of our primary service area (<https://mn.gov/oems/ambulance-services/primary-service-area-maps.jsp>), which is 435 square miles and covers the communities of Eveleth, Fayal, Central Lakes and Iron Junction, as well as portions of Gilbert (including Sparta), Clinton Township, Biwabik Township, and outlying rural unorganized territory addresses. We have an excellent working relationship with our surrounding mutual aid departments, and are always ready to help our neighbors in need, as they do for us.

We pride ourselves on being your hometown, friendly EMS service who serves our community members with compassion and top-quality care. Our EMS family is honored to have the opportunity to take care of and provide emergency care to your family.

Our staff is trained above the basic Minnesota EMT standards, including AMLS (Advanced Medical Life Support), IVs, advanced airways, and all of the medications and variances the state allows for a BLS service.

We strive to involve the community in special events, including our annual “Stuff the Ambulance” around Christmastime to collect toys for our area’s children in need, a Halloween open house which provides a safe place for children to trick-or-treat, an annual Public Safety Night hosted by the Eveleth Elks, and events during EMS Week (in May of each year). We spend the month of July stressing “summertime safety” by driving around town and handing out popsicles to kids wearing bike helmets, giving swimming safety tips at our area beaches, and being approachable friendly faces in the communities we serve.

We sincerely appreciate the opportunity to serve the citizens in our service area, and are committed to continue providing high-quality care to those in need.
